Action Research Process for Teacher Librarians Made Simple

- Consider your present program and the needs of learners today.
- ✓ Identify a target for improvement.
- ✓ Develop questions to guide your work.
- ✓ Imagine how you might achieve your target.
- Investigate what others have tried and develop your own plan.
- ✓ Try it out, adjust strategies if necessary and keep track of your evidence.
- Analyze and interpret your results.
- Prepare a summary report and share.
- ✓ Apply your findings to better address learning needs in your school library.
- Consider new questions to explore.

Tips for Getting Started

- Begin with your school/district goals.
- Align with a standard or theme or indicator from <u>Leading Learning: Standards</u> of Practice for School Library Learning Commons in Canada.
- Explore the research others have done. The Canadian School Libraries <u>Research</u> <u>Archive</u> makes scholarly and practitioner research from all Treasure Mountain Canada research symposiums accessible and searchable.
- Two heads are better than one. Find a collaborative partner or team to work with you.
